## PROVISION OF THE ACT OF JUNE 22, 1934, AMENDING THE CIVIL SERVICE RETIREMENT LAW TO PERMIT THE DESIGNATION OF A BENEFICIARY

Each annuitant or employee to whom the act applies may, under regulations prescribed by the Civil Service Commission, designate a beneficiary or beneficiaries to whom shall be paid, upon the death of the annuitant or employee, any sum standing to his credit in the Civil Service Retirement and Disability Fund.

The order of precedence of payment at death is as follows:

*First*, to the beneficiary or beneficiaries designated in writing by the annuitant or employee and recorded on his individual account;

*Second*, if there be no such beneficiary, to the duly appointed executor or administrator of the estate;

*Third*, if there be no such beneficiary, or executor or administrator, payment may be made, after the expiration of 30 days from the date of death of the annuitant or employee, to such person or persons as may appear in the judgment of the Civil Service Commission to be legally entitled thereto, and such payment shall be a bar to recovery by any other person.

### REGULATIONS

1. Annuitants and employees of the United States coming within the purview of the provisions of the Retirement Act of May 29, 1930, as amended by the act of June 22, 1934, shall be permitted to designate a beneficiary to receive the amount to their credit in the Civil Service Retirement and Disability Fund at the time of death. Where no designation of a beneficiary shall have been duly filed with the Civil Service Commission, payment of the amount in the fund to the credit of the decedent shall be made to the executor or administrator of the estate of the decedent, or in the absence of such fiduciary, to such person or persons as may appear in the judgment of the Commission to be legally entitled thereto.

2. The designation of a beneficiary, which must be in writing, signed in ink on the prescribed Form No. 2806-1, and acknowledged before some official of the Government to whom the annuitant or employee is personally known, shall be filed with the Civil Service Commission in duplicate prior to the death of said annuitant or employee to have full force and effect. The certification may be made by any supervising official of the department, branch, or independent establishment in which the annuitant or employee is or was employed, if personally known to him, or if impracticable to appear before such official, by any postmaster who is personally acquainted with the employee or annuitant. Where the annuitant or employee is physically unable to appear before an official, a letter carrier or other postal employee who is personally acquainted with such person may, if authorized by the postmaster, act as certifying official, the postmaster's signature also to appear on the certificate. The duplicate of designation shall be returned by the Civil Service Commission to the designator at the address typed or printed by him (or her) at the bottom thereof for preservation and future reference.

3. Any person, firm, corporation, or legal entity may be named as beneficiary.

4. A revocation or change of beneficiary may be made at any time, except that NO CHANGE OF BENEFICIARY WILL BE RECOGNIZED UNLESS MADE IN WRITING ON FORM 2806-2, ENTITLED "CHANGE OF BENEFICIARY", AND FILED WITH THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION, IN DUPLICATE, PRIOR TO THE DEATH OF THE ANNUITANT OR EMPLOYEE. The duplicate copy of prior designation should accompany the "Change of Beneficiary." A purported change of beneficiary in a duly probated last will and testament of an annuitant or employee shall not be recognized as a valid change of beneficiary, but shall be construed as cancelling and removing any beneficiary recorded before the date of the execution of the said will and payment shall be made as though no beneficiary had been designated.

5. A person claiming as beneficiary upon the death of an annuitant or an employee may obtain Form 3007, entitled "CLAIM OF BENEFICIARY", by communicating with the Civil Service Commission in the case of an annuitant, or the office where the decedent was last employed in the case of an employee.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO SURVIVORSHIP (CSF) ANNUITANTS

WHAT TO DO IF YOU CHANGE YOUR ADDRESS

1. Notify the Retirement Division, U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington 25, D. C. of your change of address.
2. Send your notice *before the 5th day of the month* to make certain your next check will not be delayed.
3. Use our change of address form if you have one --- Use a penny postal card if you do not.
4. Print or type your name, old address, new address, and your 'CSF' annuity claim number. Your annuity claim number appears on all checks that you receive.
5. Be sure that the *payee* of the check signs the notice of change of address. For example: If a check is issued to Mary Jones for the use of John Jones, *Mary Jones is the payee of the check.*
6. If you are receiving more than one CSF annuity check each month (for yourself and/or for the use of others), please list the CSF claim number suffix for *each* address to be changed. For example: CSF-123 456-W, A and B. This will change the address for CSF-123 456-W; CSF-123 456-A and CSF-123 456-B.
7. For your additional protection, we suggest that you also notify your postmaster before you change your address, so that mail can be forwarded to your new address.

On the basis of the death of the former employee named above, a final lump sum is payable under the Civil Service Retirement Act in the following order of precedence:

1. To the beneficiary or beneficiaries designated in writing by the former employee and recorded with the Civil Service Commission;
2. If there be no such beneficiary, to the widow or widower;
3. If neither of the above, to child or children in equal shares, with the share of any deceased child distributed among the descendants of that child;
4. If none of the above, to parents in equal shares or the entire amount to the surviving parent;
5. If none of the above, to the duly appointed executor or administrator of the estate of such employee;
6. If none of the above, to other next of kin as may be determined by the Civil Service Commission to be entitled under the laws of domicile of the employee at the time of death.

The individual entitled to payment as indicated above should execute the inclosed Application for Death Benefits in accordance with instructions thereon, and return it to the Retirement Division, U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington 25, D. C. If the application is filed by an executor or administrator, it must be accompanied by a court certificate showing his appointment.

REMARKS: In addition to a lump sum payment it appears that you are also eligible to receive a survivor annuity.
