My faith still stands and thank God my faith is greater than my Ignorance. And so let me attempt to bring back to you that mourn the peace that only comes with faith in God. The Poet Tenneyson wisely said, "It is hard to believe God, but it is harder not to."

The hand of death has struck but how comforting are these words from the great apostle Paul, "I would not have you ignorant brethren concerning them that are asleep, that ye sorrow not as <sup>those</sup> that have no hope."
