

Robert Drummond, Former Resident, Dies in California

Robert Drummond, a former resident of Honolulu, died at his home in Beaumont, Calif., last Thursday morning, according to word received here yesterday.

Mr. Drummond was born in Belfast, Ireland, on May 17, 1885. He left Ireland in 1907 going to Canada and later moving to California.

DURING WORLD War I he served with the Royal Engineers and came to Honolulu in 1924 to work for the Honolulu Iron Works. Later he was employed with the army air depot.

At the start of World War II he was transferred to the Kaneohe naval air station. He retired in 1947 and since 1948 he and Mrs. Drummond have made their home in California.

HE IS SURVIVED by the widow, the former Norine Overman of Honolulu, a daughter, one grandchild and a brother and two sisters in Canada.

Mountain View Cemetery became the final resting place for Robert Drummond, 65, when interment there followed services at the Weaver Mortuary. Drummond, a native of Belfast, Ireland, died Thursday morning, October 19, following a short illness.

Born May 17, 1885, Drummond moved from his Ireland home to Honolulu, Hawaii, became an American citizen and worked as an aviation machinist for the government as a civilian employee for 40 years. He moved to Beaumont three years ago, and resided at 1301 Elm avenue. A veteran of World War I, he served with the rank of sergeant with the Royal Engineers in the British army.

Survivors include his wife, Norine Drummond, of the home address; two sisters, Mrs. Robert Greve of Toronto, Canada, and Mrs. Robert Tower of Victoria, British Columbia, Canada; and one brother, John Drummond of Belfast.

Funeral services were conducted Saturday, October 21, at 10 a.m. with burial following immediately. Weaver Mortuary was in charge of arrangements.
